GOOD SAMARITAN SPIRIT VERY MUCH ALIVE AT TETERE

Monday March 15 has been a mile stone in the growth of the GSH (GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL) at Tetera, North East Guadalcanal. Built by the Italian volunteers from 2004 to 2008 and inaugurated on January 31, 2008 it has since then catered to the 40.000 residents of the Area it serves (a population as big or even bigger than that of some provinces of the country)

In the past year it served 23.000 out patients, it admitted 1700 patients, it served 3000 mothers before and after birth, it gave birth to 960 babies. It provided assistance to referral patients with two full time ambulance services. In addition to this it provided all other services required by the ministry of health. The hospital



now inaugurated and blessed a new three rooms facilities for Non-Communicable Diseases.

What makes the Good Samaritan Hospital unique is the cleanliness of the place and the commitment of the staff. It was very evident in the joy and friendliness of them all and very noticeable in the various speeches both by the local speakers as well as from the Provincial and national Authorities.



Sr Alice and Sr Loret of the servants of the visitation have been part of this visit on 14 March 2021. An elderly from Niu Sotiwa community expresses their gratitude towards this visit by thanking them all and sharing a simple meal together.

Pope at Regina Coeli: Encountering Christ means finding peace of heart

In finding the Risen Christ we discover peace of heart," said Pope Francis during the Regina Coeli on Easter Monday in St Peter's Square, as he spoke of the angel's appearance and the proclamation of Christ's Resurrection.

Pope Francis recalled that the day is also known as *Monday of the Angels* because it was a time when we recalled the meeting of the angel with the women who arrived at Jesus' tomb after He had risen.

He told of how Jesus's tomb was not opened by a physical phenomenon, but by the intervention of God himself, bearer of a new era, of the last times of history.

He reflected on the Easter Season and said that his wish was for everyone to have the same spiritual experience, welcoming into their hearts, into their homes and into their families the joyful proclamation of Easter.

PNG Appointed New Apostolic Nuncio

The Holy Father Pope Francis, has appointed His Excellency Most Reverend Fermín Emilio Sosa Rodríguez, as the new Apostolic Nuncio to Papua New Guinea.

The appointment was announced by the Apostolic Nunciature in Papua New Guinea in a press statement released on Wednesday 31st March, at midday in the Vatican. His appointment is also at the same time an elevation for him to the titular see of Viruno, with the dignity of Archbishop.

Reverend Fermin was ordained a priest on 12th July 1998, and graduated in Canon Law, entering the Holy See Diplomatic Service on 1st January 2003, and served in the pontifical representations in Papua New Guinea, Cote d'Ivoire, Burkina Faso, the United States of America, Canada, and Serbia.



World Day of Vocations Dedicated to St Joseph

25th April 2021, marks the World Day of Vocations and of remembrance for the 150th Anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

Although he did not appear special in the eyes of those who met him, he accomplished something extraordinary in the eyes of God, and the year 2021, is a special year devoted to him.

World Vocation Day this year focuses on informing faithful on the role of the Gospel in every day of our lives, by allowing the Lord's desire to shape the hearts of fathers and mothers: hearts that are open, capable of great initiatives, generous in self-giving, compassionate in comforting anxieties and steadfast in strengthening hopes.

God looks on the heart (1 Samuel 16:7), and in Saint Joseph he recognized the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day.
