MONTH OF APRIL 2022

Dear People of God of the Gizo Diocese, First of all allow me to greet you individually your families and communities a very PEACEFUL EASTER SEASON. Is it possible to have a peaceful Easter in time of pandemic, wars and sufferings? If by peace we mean having no problems, no enemies and no hardships to endure... then this kind of peace it not possible. Actually this is not true peace at all. We believe in an EASTER PEACE HIS peace, the one of the Risen Lord:

This kind of peace is not of this world:

- the fruit of the struggle of the paschal mystery: dying to self to build up the others
- born of the victory over all wars and pandemics in the good Friday pains of our lives
- the peace which is a gift for conversion in the struggle against our sinfulness
- a peace which is both the fruit of forgiveness and a

challenge to a Mission

- a peace which is not defeating the enemy but converting him into a friend
- this peace has a name: Jesus himself,
- His priority the Kingdom of peace, His style of life: his mission of service

St Francis of Assisi understood the peace of Jesus and applied it to solve the problem of the violent, bad wolf killing the sheep... The wolf was not bad...he was hungry. The solution was not stoning the wolf but in feeding him, peace was not in destroying the wolf but in liberating the wolf from his hunger and that is what made him a friend. After that St Francis could sing "Make me a channel of your peace..."

This is what Pope Francis keep saying about the horror of war. There is no good war, especially if God is brought in to justify it. All wars are horrible, bad, evil. They do not solve problems, they just make victims of both sides. There is no winner in a war... only losers and among them especially the innocent people. The women and the children. Bombs are costly, money and wealth meant for the people is being used to devastate cities and destroy properties, kill innocent people. We are witnessing the unbelievable horror and destruction of the war in Ukraine. We are one in condemning it with all our strength. This must create in us a conviction and a commitment to avoid what brings to violence and war and to use all the peaceful means of the Easter way to solve our family, tribal community issues. No to violence, yes to the struggle of building the peace of the Kingdom. Is building HIS kingdom of peace the real priority of our lives? "seek ye first the kingdom of God..." Is that the priority of our communities in conflict resolution?



- ST. DON BOSCO PARISH -

No signs of lockdown yet Restriction Uplifted.



No further lockdown was heard from the Oversight Committee here in our provincial capital Taro, but there are covid-19 restrictions concerning marketing and the movement of the people.

The priest said that there are no quarantine stations to keep the people who are tested positive here in Taro Island.

".... Positive and negative cases in Taro are intermingled, most people are afraid but seen the movement of people in this island is like nothing to most people, and no care attitude is very high..."

"Confirmed positive cases only in Taro Island - more or less 109, most of them are recovered and no death" The people in Taro are usualy about 600

He said that most villagers realized that processing foods are not enough during this time of the outbreak, while others are awaiting the next shipment. But Fr. Qelo said that nearby communities

like Subesube, Rabakela, and Sipokana are having their lockdown while continuing working in their garden to sustain them.

Fr. Benedict Qelo who keeps the church alive in St. Don Bosco parish Taro said that due to Covid-19 restriction, and in the previous weeks, churches were closed, "But for us Catholics, we continue celebrating the mass every day including Sunday"

He said that their pastoral activities for the year have to be delayed and church attendances decreased, and most fled for safety in the bush and sustained their living in gardens.

"But now we continue having our morning and evening prayer, especially on Sunday there are a good number of people came for the mass and for the confession in this time of Lent".

PP for St. Dominic Parish contunue his Dedication.


Despite Coronavirus here at Sirovanga getting things fresh from gardens and being lucky to have fresh fish for meals is a good sign to stay fit

Since more have experienced the illness like the common flue while others who were positive with an asymptomatic cases



So here in Nusa baruku the community is welcoming the Coronavirus.


It is very very sad...... they are coming with their

Since the shortage of food supply to the Shortland Island MV Galilee (Diocesan Ship) has loaded food supply to Nila mission station

last following weeks to keep the islanders from starving .

A few weeks ago, Southern Police commander and Migration officers intercepted more than fifty fishermen who crossed the redline border into the Bougainville Territory while the Border is still closed as predicted.

This was after the chief of the Bougainville Police Service, Deputy Commissioner Francis Tokura, has issued directions to the Southern Command, to stop people from the Shortland Islands crossing over into Bougainville.

The spokesperson for the group told police and Migrations that for 3 years they have suffered from no garden foods. They said they were living on dry coconuts that's why they needed to come to the Buin market to sell and buy food and return home.

(Food shortage has been, also experienced by St. Don Bosco parish Taro, who share the same border. But most villagers realized that food is not enough during this time of the outbreak, while others are awaiting the next shipment. But other nearby

communities like Subesube, Rabakela, and Sipokana are having their lockdown while continuing working in their garden to sustain them).

According to a report published in the Post Courier in Arawa, Bougainville, a spokesperson for the chiefs on the Bougainville said that the Solomon Island Government needs to review its PNG/Solomon Islands border based on humanitarian grounds.

Recently, the PM Soqavare has announced six short to Mediumterm measures and the National Government is proposing to

mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on Government finances.

Including is the Government's intention to reopen the country's borders by 1 July 2022 depending on achieving an effective and efficient vaccination rollout.

Last week the MV Galilee was loaded with food supply to the parts of Shortland, Mono (Treasury Island) and parts of Fauro Island.

...... A report from Nila Good Samaritan AHC Emergency Operation Center stated the five positive cases from Nila are now negative, yet new cases still coming from Gaomai, Kulitanai, and Korovou; another 6 cases which they are awaiting their follow-up swap this week.

THE COVID 19 (THE OMICRON & DELTA VIRUS)

MORE ON VIRUS. (Is it safe to be vaccinated? *continue*.)

Vaccines

1. Pfizer vaccine (mRNA Vaccine)

- The vaccine was developed which contains the information of coronavirus spike protein.
- While the vaccine was inserted into our body, it finds its way to our body cells and enters the ribosome. The ribosome reads the information of the vaccine and produces more spike proteins.
- The output of the process is; more spike proteins that contain exact information of the coronavirus spike protein are released, and they were attached and surrounded our body cells.
- Our body started to produce more body soldiers to attack these spike proteins. But actually not, but they did aware, recognized, and remember it, and it is harmless
- When the actual coronaviruses are invading they are now able to recognize, remember them and have the capacity to fight. In that way, the vaccine is protecting us.
- All this action did not take place in our DNA or nucleus (Response for our color, shape, or who we are). Our DNA is centered in the heart of our

body cells. The vaccine cannot even be getting closer or change or destroy our body cells. The process happens in the covering of our body cells called the cytoplasm, which is away from our





DNA.
