Dear Faithful people of the Gizo diocese, I am glad to send you some ideas from the Holy Father's Message linking lent with our baptismal grace

MONTHLY NEWSLE

"You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him." The message offers a reflection for each of the Sunday Gospel readings of the liturgical season.

The Holy Father noted a "particular connection" between baptism and Lent, "as the favorable time to experience this saving grace."

The mercy of God, which cancels sin and, "Baptism," the Pope said is an encounter with Christ, which informs the entire existence of the baptized, imparting divine life and calling for conversion

- the First Sunday of Lent -- Jesus' temptations in the desert -- the Pope emphasized the fragility of humanity and the strength of Christ and in union with him, a battle 'against the ruling forces who are masters of the darkness in this world,' in which the devil is at work
- The Second Sunday brings us to Christ's glory in the transfiguration, the Pontiff continued, which "announces the divinization of man." "It is the invitation to take a distance from the noisiness of everyday life in order to immerse oneself in God's presence"
- The Samaritan woman at the well is presented on Lent's Third Sunday, with Christ's request that she give him a drink. This, Benedict XVI explained, "expresses the passion of God for every man and woman, and wishes to awaken in our hearts the desire for the gift of 'a spring of water within, welling up for eternal life."

Next comes the story of the man born blind, which "presents Christ as the light of the world."

- "The miracle of this healing is a sign that Christ wants not only to give us sight," the Holy Father reflected, "but also open our interior vision, so that our faith may become ever deeper and we may recognize him as our only Savior."
- Finally, the resurrection of Lazarus on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, brings us to face "the ultimate mystery of our existence." "Communion with Christ in this life prepares us to overcome the barrier of death, so that we may live eternally with him," the Pope reflected. "Faith in the resurrection of the dead and hope in eternal life open our eyes to the ultimate meaning of our existence: God created men and women for resurrection and life."

OUR LENTEN CHALLENGE THEN THAN CAN BE THIS:

Let us renew our acceptance of the grace that God bestowed upon us at the moment of baptism, so that it may illuminate and guide all of our actions.

During this Lenten season we are called to experience God's Grace every day by following Christ in an ever more generous and authentic manner."

.The year 2010 also challenged me, and encouraged me to look forward for the betterment of the Media Services around our Diocese.

Vision:

The vision is of vibrant, articulate, inclusive and sustainable rural communities across the diocese of Gizo contributing to a prosperous, equitable, peaceful and stable society.

Mission:

The mission is to provide an effective voice (written & verbal) for and support to rural communities, particularly those who are on the isolated areas.

Regarding our Vision and Mission of the Media Services, the office has tried its best to carry out its programs of activities through Media Volunteers in the parishes through the resources available.

There are some of the areas which recommended strongly to the hands of our resource people (Media Volunteers).

However, there are also some of the improvements in the diocesan office regarding communication to the outside world and these technologies/set ups (like email station) which are quickly recommended by our parishes which may be too expensive for our Diocese. But there are some areas (Tele-Communication) such as mobiles which is affordable to individuals.

We have the only 2 Way Radio Communications which has been on operation for almost more than 15 years. And these are the recommended ones, and they were under PP or PTPA supervision.

Last year the media office organized 2 seminars and about 16 media volunteers around our diocese were involved, and have been asked to carry out the program around their own parish.

Improvements/Strengths:

Congratulations to other media volunteers who helped implement the media program around their parishes and the regular writers who still contribute writing.

Weaknesses:

Actually there are more common weaknesses and challenges been identified around each parish, the monthly newsletter distributed lately, lacking resources to motivate media volunteers in each parish.

Recommendations:

Common weaknesses like "mi les, wari belong iu ia, tumoro nao" can be solved if one realized the importance of communication in building the body of Christ in his/her own parish.

There are more recommendations (from parishes) to improve communication around our diocese, but the drawback is in not having technical people in our parish.

- ⇒ Well, the best tool/resource this office is using in getting our people to participate involving transmitting/passing the message to other people around our Diocese:-
- \Rightarrow Through Newsletter- Priests, students, laities should be involved.
- \Rightarrow Poster Messages are encouraged all through the year.
- And the office will propose a budget for the set up of a Notice Board in each parish to encourage media volunteers to carry out messages.



Sr. Rita Pitavavine OP Family Life Apostolate (FLA) Office

The year 2010 has brought me struggles and challenges to the Diocesan Family Life Office and many parishes.

The increase activities, especially the running Workshops' from the Diocesan Family Life Office and at village level, demand more resource materials, because of great needs we were forced to produce many more copies of Booklets and charts to give to the core groups for the work they had to do in the parishes.

Activities and Evaluation:

In the diocese as a whole, we trained the core groups on: Marriage Enrichment (ME), Marriage Preparation, Personality Integration for youths, Ovulation Method, Moral Teaching of the church on Conception and Abortion and HIV/AIDS Awareness.

We focused on training more young couple core groups.

The Impact of the Program:

In all our courses we talk more about gender. Understanding one's role and responsibilities in relation to their Biological make up. The majority of those who trained as core groups have commented on how they have been enriched by the program.

Parish Activities and their Achievement:

All parishes throughout the diocese have already formed their core groups and appointed parish coordinators. The FLA plans to carry out activities, in line with the Parish Pastoral Plan set up. Some parishes have completed their program on ME and others still have to complete them.

This program brings changes to other people.

Cooperation & Team Work in the parish:

With the Renewal of the Diocese and its programs, we have helped them to created team work. And some parishes are now able to work

along with the parish priest, parish coordinator and Family Life co-workers.

Problems that have encountered with Family Life Cogroups:

A great population of children, lack of Education both spiritual for young ones. Abuse committed by young couples who influence the youth and the school children, pre mature pregnancy and marriage, couples without Sacrament of Matrimony, introduction of Contraception in clinics and the use of bush herbs for abortion.

What are the Needs?

With the support of the PP, PTPA, PC and FLA co-groups should work together to plan their programs which may involve every youths, young couples. Catholic health workers need to encourage participation in the workshops on moral teachings of the church.

Our Proposal Plan this year 2011:

- 1. Personal Integration for young people.
- 2. Marriage Education for young people.
- 3. Responsible Parenthood.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who contributed in one way or the other to make our Family Life Apostolate Program happen, especially to our bishop Luciano Capelli sdb.

Saint John Bosco Senior Secondary School & Training Center

A new high school called "Saint John Bosco Senior Secondary School and Training Centre" was officially opened in Nila, Shortlands in the Western province last week on Monday.

Bishop Luciano Capelli SDB of Gizo opened the new high School.

Speaking at the occasion he said the commitment to the education of the young with collaboration between the Salesians and the local church is becoming a project which is more a more an integrated one.

During the ceremony a statue of the saint was carried in procession along the main road accompanied by the hymns and the prayers of the faithful.

The new school, built by the "Nila Mission Station" of the diocese of Gizo, will be able to benefit from the skills of the teachers formed in Salesian schools, from Salesian centres in the Philippines and of some of the first graduates of the "Don Bosco Technical Institute Secondary School and Training Centre" in Henderson, opened in 2000.

Future students, most of them from middle schools in Tuha, will follow a curriculum which combines formal lessons and workshop experience.

Following the criteria of the Technical Vocational Education Training or TVET programme 60-percent academic and 40percent technical or 70-percent hands on skills development and 30-percent academic subjects alternative.

The new school is much appreciated and supported by the local communities; hundreds have expressed their support to the new school with a great sense of pride and achievement promised to sustain the efforts for the next Phase two of the school.

Italian volunteers who generously supported the Don Bosco Henderson and Tetere projects have been very much involved in this and other Salesian projects in Tetere and Henderson.

In the meantime the owners of the land on which the Tuha Junior secondary school is built have donated the lease for 50 years thus making possible the necessary maintenance and renewal works.

The school will also have a new name - "Saint John Bosco Tuha Junior Secondary School" – following the programme already in use in the Salesian school in Henderson, opening the way for a new way of running secondary schools in the country.

As a result of the various educational projects developed in recent years some of those who graduated from the Don Bosco Institute in Henderson are now being trained in Vanga Teachers College (run by the Catholic diocese of Gizo) to provide a new kind of teacher for the country.
